The Jim Rimmer Community Scholarship for Design Award is an exciting opportunity for students to submit a completed project (or one currently in progress) for a community program, a non-profit organization, or an environmental or social cause.

Students who are currently enrolled, or have graduated within the last year (Fall 2015/ Spring 2016) from a design program in British Columbia are eligible. Scholarships will be awarded on the strength of the solution, and how effectively it communicates a message, benefits a community, affects action and promotes change.

a visual presentation of your submission on boards no larger than 9 x 12 inches. May include concept drawings, mood boards, photographs or finished work; or if digital, hard copy print-outs of key screens and a web link.

- Digital / Online Submission:

- exported and received within one PDF
- a maximum file size of 15MB total
- cleanly displayed on a 11" x 17" tabloid page (landscape only) with a 0.5" margin.

NOTE: For web design, web design components of branding design, and interactive submissions, screen captures must be placed on a tabloid size page and must include a valid url.

- GDC BC is not asking for design time or free ideas - we are asking for the presentation of ongoing or finished concepts and projects that demonstrate the use of design thinking to benefit their community and that effectively communicate a message, affect action and promote change.
- Submissions not awarded a scholarship will remain the intellectual property of the applicant. GDC BC will not implement any of the submitted projects or retain ownership of the submitted work. However, the GDC BC and Hemlock Printers Ltd. reserve the right to showcase submitted projects for the promotion of the Jim Rimmer Community Scholarship for Design, unless the applicant requests otherwise in writing.
- Applicants who want their materials returned must include a written request with their submitted proposal. They must pick up the work or pay for its return before Friday, December 4, 2016 from Hemlock Printers Ltd. in Burnaby.
- Submissions are not limited to pro-bono work.
